# Indigenous program at Lincoln

With an increasing number of Indigenous student enrolments, we're committed to ensuring that Lincoln is a culturally safe and welcoming space for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander residents. Since 2016, we've completed a number of projects and initiatives designed to make Lincoln a place that feels like home to our Indigenous residents, including the display of Indigenous art and acknowledgement of country and the Hamblby BBQ reconciliation art project. This year we appointed a resident Indigenous Advisor, ran cultural awareness training for all Residential Advisors and Academic Tutors and we now proudly fly the Aboriginal flag alongside the Australian flag and Lincoln flag, outside our Admin building.

A big thank you goes to our inaugural resident Indigenous Advisor, Mai-Sie Crawford-Owers (who hails from Barkindji country in NSW) for her valued advice and contribution to all our initiatives. We'd like to express our gratitude to local Kaurna elders, Aunty Rosemary Wanganeen and Uncle Rod O'Brien, for developing a relationship with Lincoln and also thank Aboriginal artist Narisha Cash (who has Jingili and Mudburra heritage), as well as Dawn Hawthorn Jackson and Uncle Major "Moogy" Sumner (a Ngarrindjeri elder) from Emu Consulting, for their involvement and continued support in these initiatives. We'd also like to thank former Chair of the Lincoln Board, Gregor Ramsay, for donating funds to purchase the Aboriginal flag, as a symbol of his long-time support for Indigenous education. A special mention must also go to Katrina Levesque, a Youth Work intern at Lincoln in 2016, for her pivotal work in establishing the ongoing steps we've taken to ensure Indigenous residents feel included and welcomed.

# Thinker in residence

***"Social entrepreneurs are not content just to give a fish or teach how to fish. They will not rest until they revolutionised the fishing industry"*** – Bill Drayton, Founder of Ashoka.

Lincoln is no stranger to hosting renowned members of the international and local academic community. This year social entrepreneur Allyson Hewitt stayed at Lincoln, whilst she served as the inaugural Thinker in Residence (TiR) for the re-established TiR program. The program, led by the South Australian Don Dunstan Foundation, is devoted to social change through policy and system adjustment in areas of social justice projects. Over the next few years, the program hopes to re-design social innovation systems so that private, public and non-for profit sectors can become more effective in the delivery of important issues ranging from water environmental sustainability to transport to education.

Allyson is an admirable participating thinker and her range of experience was inspiring. As a Senior Fellow for Social Innovation at the highly successful MaRS Discovery District in Canada, Allyson has assisted hundreds of social ventures to become economically sustainable and maximize their social impact. Allyson also played an active role in the MaRS Solutions Lab, an organisation designed to tackle complex challenges; and Studio Y, an initiative

designed to support young people to thrive in the new economy.

It was an amazing opportunity to hear Allyson speak and witness her passion for social innovation. In a room full of university students commencing their journey into the world and wanting to make a change, Allyson was an inspiring figure who remained relatable. She began her journey taking courses that people at Lincoln are currently studying, Bachelor of Criminology before advancing to Law and Management. She broadened our understanding of the limits of what students can accomplish and achieve with their degrees. Her enthusiasm was urgent in every action and word and it was clear that her passion for social innovation was the driving force behind where she is today, a successful woman in the field of social justice and international collaboration, making a sustainable and positive mark on the world and in the lives of others.


